With more than 60 visitors representing approximately 18 families, the event truly showcased the joy and diversity of our community. The farm buzzed with energy as little ghosts, goblins, and ghouls explored the venue in fancy dress.

A Season of Calm, Connection and Christmas Magic




Nourish Support Centre transformed holiday tradition into something profoundly thoughtful, joyful, and inclusive. Over 20 family groups took part in our specially designed Sensory Santa Sessions, ensuring every child could experience festive wonder on their own terms.

Held across eight sessions throughout weekends and weekday evenings, families were welcomed into the enchanting Santa Wonderland Grotto, a space intentionally created to be calm, engaging, and accessible. By scheduling individual 30-minute time slots for each family, the grotto became not just a visit, but an immersive experience where time slowed down, senses came alive, and each child felt seen.

By hosting sessions after 6:00 PM and on weekends, we opened the door for working families and created a quieter environment, reducing sensory overwhelm and easing access for those who might otherwise feel excluded.

The Sensory Santa Sessions reflect Nourish's belief that inclusion isn't an add-on, it's the starting point.

By honouring each child's pace, preferences, and potential, we gave families the gift of connection, confidence, and Christmas spirit.

We've also created quiet spaces to decompress, supporting emotional wellbeing and giving everyone the option to take part at their own pace.

The group's flexible format makes it accessible for families juggling different schedules, and its consistent popularity is a testament to how deeply it resonates.

One parent shared, "It's the one evening my child always looks forward to, they feel relaxed, accepted, and excited to share what they've made or played."

On 10th July, we marked National Teddy Bears' Picnic Day with a heart warming community event in the park and it was a roaring success! A total of 11 families joined us, with 39 people attending for a day filled with laughter, connection, and teddy bear adventures. Families took part in a sponsored approx. 2 mile woodland walk, raising funds to support future activities at Nourish. After the walk, we enjoyed a sunny picnic, traditional outdoor games like sack races, egg and spoon and parachute play. The event ended with a medal ceremony, where every walker received a medal for their brilliant effort. A day where families gathered, bringing inclusion through play.

Circus Family Day

Giggles, Glue and a visit from the Zoo!

The Circus Family Day at Nourish Support Centre welcomed 28 individuals from 9 families, with children ranging from 2 years to 13 years. The session offered a relaxed and inclusive environment that encouraged choice led participation and supported children with additional needs.

Across a structured 4 hour programme, attendees engaged in tailored activities, including clown face crafts, circus themed games, face painting, and balloon sculpting, all designed to nurture creativity, social confidence, and sensory comfort.

A communal lunch of hot pizza provided a moment of shared connection, while the afternoon's hands-on session with the Mini Zoo Man created learning experiences through inclusive animal interactions. Feedback was gathered through both visual photo evaluation and an evaluation developed for children, with 95% participation, and captured strong indicators of emotional safety, engagement, and family bonding.



Pirates & Princess's

Planks, Peas, Parrots & Piñatas!

Nourish Community Hub was transformed into a magical kingdom and high-seas adventure as part of our Pirates & Princesses themed family day, delivered in collaboration with *Play on Wheels*. The event was designed to support inclusive, self-directed play in a welcoming space where fantasy met freedom.

Children explored at their own pace, from treasure hunts and finding "peas from the Princess's bed" challenges, to walking the plank across shark-infested waters (complete with a shark piñata!). Life-sized pirate boats and a princess castle brought imagination to life, offering dress-up, storytelling, and sensory-rich discovery.

The crafting station was packed all day with activities suitable for a range of ages and abilities, from balloon sculpting, to sewing parrots and from tattoo transfers to scratch off crowns and much more!
